

OLDER AMERICANS MONTH – 2015

May is Older Americans Month. The Administration on Aging denotes this celebration as a way to draw attention to acknowledge the past and present older persons in our country. This year's theme is "Get Into the Act". When Older Americans Month was established in 1963, only 17 million living Americans had reached their 65th birthday. About a third of older Americans lived their life in poverty; and there were few programs to meet their needs. Interest in older Americans and their concerns was growing. A meeting in April 1963 between President John F. Kennedy and members of the National Council of Senior Citizens led to designating May as "Senior Citizens Month", the prelude to "Older Americans Month".

Every President since Kennedy has issued a formal proclamation for Older Americans Month asking that the entire nation pay tribute in some way to older This is celebrated persons in their communities. across the country through ceremonies, events, fairs and other such activities. Each of us can do something to honor our older Americans. NEW DEVELOPEMENT IS ON THE WAY!

The City of Detroit has finally announced a planned \$50 million renovation for the 51,780-square-foot Brewster Wheeler Recreation Center near downtown in the Brush Park Paradise Valley district. The redevelopment will be accompanied by a 100- to 150-unit apartment complex across the street from the Brewster facility where Joe Louis once trained.

FYI: The Harlem Globetrotters played their first tour game on Thanksgiving day in 193 at the Brewster Wheel Rec center. It was the first time the team had played in a major city.

The reason for this delay was because Detroit city council members wanted to be certain that Olympia Development of Michigan would also renovate the historic Hotel Eddystone near the site of the where the new arena is planned to constructed.

The Ilitch organization strongly sought out the council's approval of the renovation of the vacant, former hotel in a rezoning package in exchange for Olympia's plan to demolish the old Hotel Park Avenue, a historic site adjacent to the Eddystone that is also vacant.


