Each resident has signed that they have "read and received a copy" of this handbook and that violations of the rules may have unpleasant consequences. Since we most definitely do NOT want evictions, this section we will bring the policies to your attention and will serve as a reminder.

If you have any specific topics you would like us to focus on, please come to the office.

44. PARKING/PARKING LOTS: Individual parking spaces are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Only a limited number of handicapped accessible parking spaces are available. Only Residents with a valid handicapped sticker or plate are authorized to occupy the handicapped parking spaces. All vehicles must have a valid state registration, valid license plate and be in operating condition. All resident vehicles must be registered with Management. If you change vehicles, please notify the office immediately.

Please park in a manner that allows other cars easy access. Vehicles must not take up more than one parking space each. For everyone's safety, keep your speed at a safe and reasonable level and observe all posted speed limit and stop signs. It is the responsibility of Residents to move their own vehicles during and after inclement weather as requested by Management to clean or repair the parking lot. No commercial vehicles are allowed to be parked or stored on site. Vehicles found in a stored or junk condition (ie. flat tires, expired or missing license plate) will be towed if not removed within ten (10) days of notification by management. If a vehicle needs to be towed, it will be at the owner's expense. Car repairs, oil changes and car washing is not permitted on the property due to potential damage to our asphalt and landscaping. Management assumes no responsibility for damage, theft or destruction of any vehicle, or its contents, parked on or around the property.

1. REAC Inspection RESULT from March 14th.

- 1. Any caulking that needs to be done in your apartment will happen when the Air Conditioners are installed. We will notify you of the dates when they are chosen.
- 2. So far the garbage chutes have been working pretty well. However, a couple reminders for going forward: Bags MUST be tied and there should be no loose trash put down the chute.
- 3. Take a look at the screens in your unit and let the office know if you have any holes or rips so they can be repaired or replaced.
- 4. If you had a garden plot last year which had plants that will be coming up again this year, you will need to remove them temporarily as we are going to prepare the garden beds. We are working on setting up the lottery, so if you are interested in a plot, please let the office know.

Recipe Swap

- 2 eggs
- 2 cups white sugar
- 2 cups flour
- 2 tsp soda
- 1 cup chopped nuts
- 1 (20 oz) can crushed pineapple with juice

Lemony Tortellini Bacon Salad

- 2 cups (8 oz) cheese tortellini
- 4 cups fresh broccoli florets
- ¾ cup mayonnaise
- 1 Tbsp balsamic vinegar
- 2 tsp fresh lemon juice
- ¾ tsp dried oregano
- ¼ tsp salt
- 1 (5 oz) package of spring mix salad greens
- 4 bacon strips, cooked and crumbled

Directions

- In a large saucepan, cook tortellini as directed...adding broccoli in the last 5 minutes of cooking.
- 2. Meanwhile, in a small bowl, mix mayo, vinegar, lemon juice, oregano, and salt.
- Drain tortellini and broccoli...gently rinse with cold water.
- **4.** Transfer to a large bowl.
- **5.** Add dressing, toss to coat.
- **6.** Serve over salad greens and sprinkle with bacon.

Directions

- 1. Mix all together.
- 2. Pour into greased and floured 9 x 13 pan.
- 3. Bake at 350° for 45 minutes.

Frosting:

Mix the following until smooth and creamy, then spread on cake:

- 8oz. cream cheese (softened)
- 1 stick of margarine
- 2 cups powdered sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla
- Milk (for consistency)

Using the ingredients above plus 2 tsp Vanilla and use ½ cup of walnuts instead of 1 cup chopped nuts.

Mix flour, sugar, and soda all together. Add pineapple, eggs, and vanilla. Add walnuts.

Frosting:

- 8oz. cream cheese
- 1 stick oleo
- 13/4 cups powdered sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla

Spread on cake while it is still quite hot.

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
